SAFETY ALERT:

Our community has seen an increase in coyote sightings. We can agree this is a concerning situation. These recommended safety measures help protect both us and our pets.

- 1. **Secure attractants:** Store trash in heavy-duty, secure bins, and take them out the morning of pickup. Avoid leaving pet food or water outside, especially overnight. Clean up fallen fruit and keep barbecue grills clean.
- 2. **Remove hiding spots:** Trim low-level tree branches and dense shrubs to eliminate hiding places. Keep your property free of debris and repair any gaps in fences or under decks.
- 3. **Secure pets and livestock:** Keep small pets, especially cats and small dogs, inside, particularly from dusk to dawn when coyotes are most active. Secure small livestock like poultry in predator-proof pens at night.
- 4. **Use motion-sensitive lighting:** Installing motion-sensor lights can help deter coyotes from entering your yard.
- 5. **Remove bird feeders:** Remove bird feeders or clean up fallen seed regularly, as the rodents they attract can also draw coyotes.

What to do if you encounter a coyote

- 1. **Do not run:** Running can trigger a coyote's predatory instincts.
- 2. **Make noise:** Yell, clap, or use a whistle to make yourself as loud as possible.
- 3. **Look intimidating:** Wave your arms and make yourself appear bigger and stomp your feet.
- 4. **Back away slowly:** Give the coyote an escape route and let it leave on its own.
- 5. **Protect pets and children:** Keep small children and pets close to you. Pick up small dogs if a coyote approaches.
- 6. **Throw objects:** If the coyote doesn't retreat, throw small objects like sticks or rocks in its direction.
- 7. **Fight back if attacked:** If a coyote makes physical contact, fight back immediately.
- 8. **Call authorities:** Call animal control or 911 if a coyote makes physical contact or if you feel your life is in danger.
